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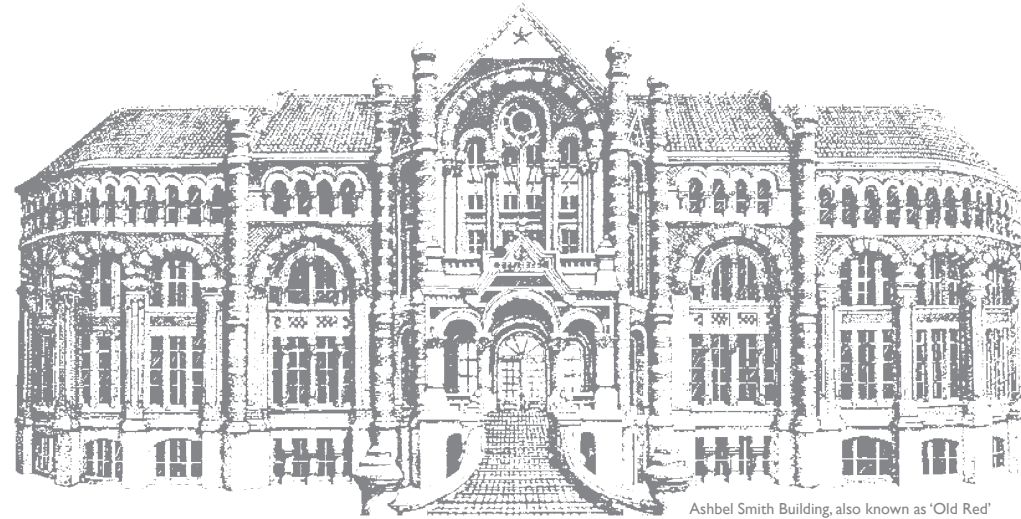

General Information

Course Description

This course is designed for the primary care physician, and the subspecialist offering primary care services. Succinct, clinically practical presentations that cover a broad range of topics will enable the practicing physician to remain up-to-date in the ever-changing practice of internal medicine.

Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of the course, the participant should be able to:

- Recognize advances in primary care medicine with particular emphasis on the management of gout, obesity, asthma and preoperative cardiac risk assessment.
- Review changes in the therapy of Methicillin-Resistant Staph aureus, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, peripheral vascular disease and Hepatitis C.
- Recognize advances in the understanding of cancer screening in the elderly, the hypercoagulable state, prevention of DVT in hospitalized patients and the metabolic complications of obesity.
- Describe the approach to patients with pulmonary fibrosis, rhinosinusitis.
- Gain greater insight into the epidemiology of a natural disaster and dealing with death.
