GENERAL INFORMATION

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

This course is designed to address the challenges faced in the diagnosis and treatment of medical conditions of infants, children and adolescents. It will provide participants with a maximal learning experience through lectures interspersed with question and answer sessions, panel discussions, and workshops of specific interest.

AUDIENCE

This educational activity is designed for practicing physicians and other clinicians who care for infants, children and adolescents.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this course, the participant should be able to:

- Identify and describe difficult problems in adolescents, such as weight loss, typical skin problems, counseling about lifestyle issues, and heart problems.
- Incorporate the latest information on hot topics in infectious disease, including avian flu, vaccinations, drug-resistant organisms, and Group B streptococcal infections, into daily practice.

In workshop format, opportunities will be provided for participants to:

- Interpret radiographs.
- Discuss management strategies for kidney disease, management of the near-term newborn, techniques used to establish rapport with children using magic tricks, and teaching strategies in the medical setting.
- Determine how to choose the right electronic medical record system.
